For 15 long months, cruise ships that had long dwarfed the candy-coloured buildings of St. John's were ominously absent.

Since the return of the first passenger-laden vessels in July, increasing cruise ship numbers are once again bringing the capital alive with visitors. The future looks brighter still for cruising as the redevelopment of the city port continues. Visitors can also look forward to new retail and restaurant outlets over the next 18 months. The completion of a **new pier allows entry for Oasis Class vessels** – the largest in the world – paving the way for the country to serve as many as one million papagenger a upper

reappearance – signalling the resurgence of one of our major tourism source markets.

Meanwhile, with some sectors reporting as much as **80 percent herd immunity**, the government has lifted many of the constraints on the entertainment industry for fully vaccinated patrons. Bars and nightclubs reopened to business in mid-November, with live music and dancing also now permitted. Mid-October saw the reopening of gyms and restaurants for inhouse dining, while excursion companies and pleasure craft are once again free to operate.
